


Statement on Accounting & Reporting Practices

UWHC has a stringent system of checks and balances in place to ensure it operates in a sound fiscal manner. The organization's operating budget, as well as its community funding decisions, are reviewed and approved by several volunteer committees, as well as the board of directors.

Agencies Supporting UW Initiatives











Under the leadership of the Grant Committee, more than 30 local businesses & 45 volunteers serving on 7 review teams, ultimately made recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding program funding. Each team based their decisions on a site visit and comprehensive interviews with agency representatives. Through this process, CIG Team Members gain an important understanding of strained challenges, compromised issues and financial concerns escalating within our community.

United Way believes in giving pre-school children the educational tools to be successful in school through the **Dolly Parton Imagination Library**. Creating opportunities for a better tomorrow one book at a time! Approximately 50,106 books have been distributed within our community to date, impacting the imagination of pre-schoolers.



In 2007, UWHC brought on the **ANNUAL STUFF THE BUS** program. This event brings school supplies to teachers and their classrooms. In **2012**, UW provided over **210** teachers with school supplies to service Hernando County students. Stuff the Bus is an important component in giving teachers the tools needed to help children succeed in education!



Did you know, there are approximately 507,000 Florida children without healthcare coverage? UWHC has partnered with UW of Marion County & Florida KidCare (FKC); a low cost health insurance program for children. The UWHC office, Hernando County Public Libraries, Mid Florida Community Services, Head Start, and A New Generation are certified to assist residents filling out FKC applications.



United Way is in partnership with the Internal Revenue Service & supports the VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance)
Program. These volunteers are fully trained & IRS certified to complete tax returns for low income residents. In 2013,
our volunteers filed over 735 income tax returns, saving Hernando County residents over \$801,707!



The V.R.C. is a Volunteer Reception Center. The VRC prequalifies volunteers for organized efforts during hurricane season, floods, fires, etc. In 2012, UWHC organized a rally for the recruitment of new Core Volunteers. These volunteers maintain a key role during a disaster in our community.

Success By 6 is an early childhood initiative that works to ensure that all children from **birth to 6** have the positive and enriching experiences necessary to begin school prepared to succeed. Through data-tracking, advocacy, public awareness, and neighborhood-based programs, Success By 6 collaborates with its partners to positively impact community-indicators that lead to school readiness.


