


# **Financial Stewardship**





## UNABLE TO KEEP AND **1** EMERGENCY FROM GROW THEIR ASSETS FALLIN

Did you know that United Way works in conjunction with Hernando County's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) before, during, and after a local disaster? UW serves as a lead organization for disaster relief resources and Hernando's Unmet Needs Committee. The aftermath of September 2017's Hurricane Irma continues to impact our community as those who were already one crisis away from poverty struggle to catch up. Well over 60+ Hernando households were displaced.
