United Way and the CIG Committee utilizes Review Team Members who are willing to help review grant applications and interview local non-profits for Community Investment Funding. You won't be alone in this process! Each member is placed on a

team of 5-7 community members and given a grant application for 1-3 applying agencies.

Some members are loyal UW donors, some are first time givers and would like to see where their dollars go, some are curious about what United Way does, and others are simply wanting to make a difference! When reviewing the applications online through e-CImpact, you have access to their grant proposal and will submit recommendations.



These are the primary factors that help hold United Way accountable for the hundreds of thousands of dollars that are raised and allocated each year.

Strategically Investing Community Dollars

When evaluating the Agencies and their programs, there are a few main things you want to keep in mind:

- Are their services needed in our community? Ι. (Are they meeting those needs?)
- 2. What are their outcomes from last year? (Do they project to increase impact this coming year?)
- 3. Do you believe the program requesting funding will fit into the United Way model? (Are they a good Partner?)
- If allocated funds, how do they plan on spending them? 4. (Are they detailed about what funds will go towards?)
- 5. How do their financials look? (Are they accountable?)

Timeline for United Way of Hernando County's Community Investment Grant Process

January/February End of February PHASE I

The CIG Eligibility Process is opened to the unity. Interested 501c3 non-profits submit the required information nline to United Way prior to deadline. (new and/or existing Partner Programs must complete)

A walk through of the online CIG application is provided. Guidelines are discussed and Q&A. The CIG grant process is open for two months from March to the end of April. Applications are submitted

CIG Review Teams will meet for a 2 hour virtual Workshop.
